Farm 11 now has clean water to prevent sickness and disease!

This year saw the final renovations at Farm 11 with the completion of the Water Project. We battled through some of the worst flooding in Romania's recent history which made installation of the main drainage a huge challenge. Though the completion date was 6 weeks later than we expected, everything has been finished and is now functioning, giving the families running water, showers and toilets for the first time in their lives. The families at the farm can not thank God, and HFTN-RO enough for this life changing gift of kindness!

Farm 10 Roof finished



We started this project two years ago with the doors, windows, building exteriors, insulation, finishing. This year we replaced the roof and as a result, everyone is warm and dry this winter.

Adult & Child Literacy Social Integration through Home Care Courses



Farm 10 and 11 have benefited from ongoing literacy training 4 days per week for the past year and a half. Our team (Izabella, Cristina, and Simona) are qualified school teachers and social workers and are doing wonders with the children and adults that need to learn literacy. The children are taken once a month to a local museum or site of interest to learn about their own culture and to spend time off the farm.

Izabella also helps children who are struggling with their school work and liaisons between the farm children and their school to make sure they stay on track. In addition, she counsels those who have questions about family life, both from a practical and spiritual perspective.

This year also saw 30 graduates in our EU Certified Home Care Course, which opened the doors to employment for several families bringing much needed income and advancement to their lives.

Medical Assistance

In 2009 and 2010, Romania cut back funds to their already overtaxed Social Medical Program. Patients are now required to pay for portions of their treatment, which in most cases, is more than they can afford.

ROMANIA FACES ONE OF THE WORST SOCIAL ECONOMIES SINCE THE COMMUNIST ERA

As a direct result, countless people in the villages of Romania find themselves with not enough medical coverage. Many have stopped visiting the doctor and are now facing needless illness and even death.

Our Medical Assistance Program helps reach a few of those who find themselves in this precarious situation.








ANGELA

Flood Relief for the town of Ciobanu, Romania



In July of 2010, Romania faced yet again, tremendous flooding near the Danube River. HFTN

- Romania was able to help the village of Ciobanu and bring tents and food to 150 people who were devastated by the flood. The houses in this area are earthen based and when the water receded, many of the structures were no longer safe for habitation.

INTL. MEDICAL WORKSHOPS

We continue our work organizing International Medical Workshops in Romania and the Republic of Moldova, bringing in specialists from Germany and Austria to instruct the local doctors on modern life saving procedures they currently do not use in the East. Many children's lives have already been saved as a result.

This year's workshop was a challenge because of the Iceland Volcano eruption which shut down all the major airport hubs of Europe. It happened exactly during the week of our conference and the main doctor, (Dr. Thomas Boemers of Koln, Germany) was unable to fly to Romania. We had doctors from Austria, Romania and the Republic of Moldova present to do evaluations on children for our major workshop which will be in March 2011 at the University of Chisinau, in The Republic of Moldova, Dr. Boemers is

confirmed, as is Dr. Ardelean of Austria, to head up the team during the March workshop. The Government of The Republic of Moldova has recognized the HFTN-Romania International Workshop and the Department of Health is offering all Moldovan doctors who attend, University Credits towards their personal accreditation. The dates of the HFTN - Romania International Medical Workshop for congenital organ malformation will be March 19-24, 2011.

HOME MAKEOVER 2010


